Memorandum to Father Walsh:

Last evening I noticed that the class in History of Europe V scheduled for 9:10 P.M. in Room 11 was not in session. A check of all other class rooms was made to insure that the class was not being held in some other room but I was unable to locate either Dr. Quigley or any members of the class.

I find upon further investigation this morning that Dr. Quigley announced to the class during the first week of the summer session that inasmuch as he had engaged the services of a baby sitter for Wednesday evenings that he found it necessary to change the hours which had been established by the effice. He proposed that the class would meet five minutes earlier than scheduled (9:05 P.M.) and remain evertime ten minutes each evening (10:10 P.M.), thus permitting him to eliminate the class scheduled for Wednesday evening. The class scheduled for Wednesday June 21 and for Wednesday June 28 have not been held.

Another change in class schedule was also submitted to the class. It was decided that the class scheduled for Monday July 3 be disposed with and that class held on Wednesday July 5, thus permitting all concerned a longer weekend. I can only surmise that the baby sitter was be going away for the holiday on that Wednesday evening?

All of the above changes have been made without consulting any member of the administrative staff.
