

THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF CARROLL QUIGLEY OF WASHINGTON, D.C.
16 April 1973

This is my last will and testament, which I ask my survivors to accept and carry out to the best of their abilities.

To my wife, Lillian Fox Quigley of Washington, D.C., I give and bequeath all my interest in our house at 1148 Greenwich Parkway, NW., Washington, D.C. I also leave to her any money which I have in the American Security & Trust Company of this city, both in my savings account and in my checking account. She will also have the benefits of my various insurance policies, on my life and naming her as beneficiary.

To my older son, Denis Carroll Quigley, I leave any interest or property I have in the houses at 5112 Saratoga Avenue, Montgomery County, Maryland, whose postal address is Washington, D.C., 20016.

To my younger son, Thomas Fox Quigley, now living in Virginia, I leave my interests and property at the Farm we bought in Berkeley County, West Virginia, a few miles northwest of Banotown. I hope that he may own and may enjoy that land as much as I have.

To Helen Elisabeth Veit of Washington, D.C., my long-time helper and academic assistant, I leave all my scholarly books and papers, including periodicals, research notes and lecture notes, the copyrights I have on books, and all finished or partly finished books and articles, in the hope that she may be able to obtain publication of those works which remain unpublished and may be able to finish some of those which remain unfinished. I appoint her my literary and scholarly executor with full power to do what she believes to be best, since she is, I believe, the only person with full understanding of what have been the aims of my studies, teaching, and writings. To help her to carry out this work, I give and bequeath to her any and all money or properties which are in the National Bank of Washington, both in my savings account there, number 4-173-104, and in the safe-deposit box which we have had there jointly for several years.
