Lillian Fox Quigley, 75, a former George Washington University official who administered off-campus programs in the College of General Studies, died of sepsis March 4 at Woodbine Nursing Home in Alexandria.

Mrs. Quigley, who lived in Bethesda, was born in New York. She moved to the Washington area in 1941 and attended GWU. She worked in the College of General Studies there from the late 1950s into the 1970s.

Her husband, Carroll Quigley, died in 1977. Survivors include a son, Thomas Fox Quigley of Alexandria, and a sister, Dorothy Otterbacher of Crofton.

Thomas Fox Quigley, 49, an area construction inspector and road median painter since the 1960s, died March 17 at his home in Alexandria after a stroke.
